## Wife Worked For Ruby

Wanda Killam said her husut band returned to Florida in earnt, ly December, 1963, saying he a: was going to look for a job. She stayed in Dallas, where she had been employed for several years on as a hostess in a night club owned by Jack Ruby.

Ruby, who died of cancer while in custody, was charged with the slaying of Lee Harvey Oswald, accused of killing President Kennedy in Dallas November 22, 1963.

Mr. Killam said she, too, fan vored an investigation of her e husband's death and said of the suicide ruling: "No, Hank wouldn't do that."

House Painter

She siad her husband was briefly employed in Dallas as a house painter by a man named Jack Carter, Earl Killam said Carter once roomed in the same Dallas boarding house as Oswald.

Killam said that after his brother returned to Florida he spent four months in Tampa and then returned to Pensacola March 15 to live with their mother.
