Coretta Scott King, wife of the slain civil rights leader, said Monday at the second annual Institute on Nonviolent Social Change that she "has not been pleased so far with the lack of progress (made by President Carter) toward full employment."

King also said that she believes Americans are turning toward non-violence as a way of achieving social change.
