Dear Mr. Weisberg:

During the course of searching their records to respond to your Freedom of Information Act appeal of July 21st, 1977, officials at the Central Intelligence Agency found one document that had been obtained from the Department of the Army which included information pertaining to Martin Luther King. The document was therefore forwarded to us to determine whether or not it could be released to you. We received it on January 6, 1978.

The document consists of a copy of a cover sheet, and a copy of each of five typewritten pages extracted from a May 1966 Third United States Army Monthly Intelligence Summary. Under the circumstances and pursuant to our procedures -- which are codified in 32 CFR 518 -- we have sent the document to the Commander of our U. S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, Fort Meade, Maryland. You may expect to hear from him soon concerning his determination.
