Charlie Stephens was in an intoxicated position eh, condition and could not tell us too much at that particular time. So, I left it up to other investigators to talk to him at a later time.

Were you, or any of your colleagues able to talk to anybody in the rooming house who had seen the person who might have shot Dr. King?

No, I eh, not that I can recall. The only one I talked to was Charlie Stephens himself at that particular time, he didn't have much information to give us then, so I went about my business of making the photographs and looking for evidence or whatever

And you say that he was eh, he was intoxicated.

Eh, he was in an intoxicated state. How about his wife, where was she? She was on the bed. She never did get off the bed.

And was she able to say that she had seen anybody coming backwards.....

No, she was not able to talk to us.

Were you able to talk to anybody else around the area who might have seen the person who could have killed Dr. King?

Well we talked to many people down there. I talked to Solomon Jones, the chauffuer who was standing down there, who eh, was pointing back over towards the building where the shot had come from and eh, at that that time there were multiple mulberry bushes upon a hill....and Solomon Jones told me that he had seen a person running down the bushes.
