Tyler said there was no spectrographic analysis of anything but the King clothing. This, of course, served no purpose without something with which to compare that analysis.

Attached to the April 29, 1964 FBI lab report the test of which is propaganda rather than fact is a listing of the elements found in the death slug and several bullets with which it was compared. ^{Its core} It held an element the main bullet of comparison did not have, enough to raise doubts if not more. Eight chemical components are listed. But not a single measurement with regard to any. Or, half a spectroscopy was safer than one full one.

Seven elements were identified in the jacket. Not one figure or measurement or proportion, the entire purpose of the tests.

And where there are figures, for antimony, the differences are considerable.
