I then had a call from an old friend and very good reporter who, after a long lapse of time, got interested in something I'd sent him long ago and he'd lost. So I made copies and at this moment am awaiting a Federal Express. If it pans out it will be of some significance and you'll know. But he asked me to say nothing about it so I do not.

If it does I think you'll agree that the coincidence is truly remarkable. But I had nothing to do with his call. He'd called me a while back, maybe a week ago, to ask me if something fit with that stuff, which he'd mislaid. I told him it was not possible. Somehow, perhaps having nothing to do with me and perhaps because he recalled something I'd suggested long ago, he phoned me about this yesterday and also reported what progress he'd made.

If it does not stack when he's done I'll let you know the whole thing.
