These letters from the main FBIHQ Murkin file and not all on this incident, ote that they are after the assassination and the FBI HQ still had the hots for anything that could be used, no matter how wrongly, to defame the then dead king.



On 4/26/68, Continental Cab Co, 2222 Tilden Ave, Brooklyn, NY, made available the trip sheets of all drivers from 1/1/68 through 3/31/68.

The trip sheets for were pulled and reviewed and no trip could be located from International Hotel, Kennedy Airport to La Guardia and on to the east side of Manhattan.

and reviewed all of his trip sheets from 1/1/68 to 3/31/68 and was unable to locate the trip where he transported Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, his aide and the white woman.

Was unable to furnish any additional information that would assist in identifying this white woman. He further stated that he has no reason to believe that she had anything to do with the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, but if he should see this woman in the future he would make attempts to further identify her and make this information available to the FBI.
