

Bar Won't ^{Post} Punish Brown ^{10/30/71} Prosecutor

ELLCOTT CITY, Md., Oct. 29 (AP)—The Howard County Bar Association has apparently decided not to take any disciplinary action against Richard Kinlein, the county prosecutor found guilty last week of contempt of court.

"There is no matter relating to Kinlein . . . which is pending before the bar association or any of its committees," the association said in a brief statement.

According to a leading member of the county bar, who asked to remain anonymous, most of the association's member of the county bar, who asked to remain anonymous, most of the association's members believe that Mr. Kinlein received his punishment from the court and that is sufficient."

Kinlein, 35, was fined \$350 and court costs by two Circuit Court judges, who ruled that he made "prejudicial" statements concerning the pending arson case against black militant H. Rap Brown.

A spokesman for the state bar association earlier said his organization would not consider any action against Kinlein until his appeal of the contempt citation to the State Court of Special Appeals is decided.

Brown, meanwhile, was transferred from his room at Roosevelt Hospital in New York to the prison ward at the city-operated Bellevue Hospital. Brown was captured and shot by New York police two ~~weeks~~ ago.
