Many thanks for phoning Deyahn, which let her know my letters apparently are being intercepted. I have made formal complaint to the post office. That merely makes a record of it, does not stop it. This is what has happened to our country, to our freedoms.

Again, I encourage you to quietly do what I have already written you about. I think it is important for everyone concerned that a full and accurate record be established. Thereafter, consider what you may want me to do to help when I am there. I have some things in mind.

I am enclosing a copy of the letter I wrote Deyahn after she phoned me. Would you please let her know you have received it? If these letters go through promptly, her copy should reach school on Saturday, when she is not there. Of course, it is always possible that it has been arranged for the student-postmaster to do the intercepting, but other of my mail is being tampered with, some letters taking more than a week too long.

I am looking forward to being there again, as I will 11/5.

Please excuse the haste. I am really clogged up.
