3. Circuits correspond to the Federal Judicial Circuits. Vote for the candidate or candidates given for your Circuit only. Overseas members not in Circuits, please vote for the candidate in the Circuit of your legal residence in the United States.
4. Do not sign this ballot or place any identifying mark on it. Fold it on the arrows and insert it in the enclosed return envelope which is pre-addressed to the Nominations and Elections Committee at National Headquarters. Do not place your name and return address on the envelope unless you personally prefer to do so. Stamp and mail (or deliver in person) within the time hereinabove prescribed.
5. A ballot has been sent to each FBA member qualified to vote (members in good standing who have paid current year's dues), in accordance with the FBA Constitution and By-Laws.
