

ITT Papers To Be Sent To Allende

SANTIAGO, March 23—Chilean President Salvador Allende intends to read the texts of the documents released by columnist Jack Anderson before commenting publicly on the alleged CIA-ITT plot to intervene in Chile's electoral process in 1970.

His decision was made known in conversations at the presidential palace today. Members of the official family made no effort to hide their belief that the Anderson reports have presented Allende with a political prize of great value.

Allende and his supporters have railed for years against intrigues of the CIA and foreign companies. "This shows we were right all along," said a Communist deputy.

Anderson's documents indicate that ITT and the CIA sought to prevent Allende, a Marxist, from assuming power a year and a half ago.

The Chilean ambassador in Washington is sending the text of the documents, but Allende is not expected to have read all of them until sometime next week.
