To whom it may concern:

I would like to know what was the part of Canada in U. S. oil imports in 1973; please give me approximate figures in barrels, \$ or % of total imports. I heard the other day on TV (Washington Week in Review) that Canada was the main supplier of U. S. oil. Such imports were completely discontinued in 1974. In the meantime, sabre rattling and brain washing (Bourrage de crans) of U. S. -born suckers by our so-called "Free Press" is intensifying. The culprits are the "greedy" arabs. As Chekov one wrote -- that if in the first act you hang a gun on the wall, in the third act it has to be used. The "capitalistic" world is falling apart economically. I am wondering about the naivete of Arab countries holding their oil profits in dollars and pound -- monies "qui sont foutu", instead of scooping gold, silver and platinum and saving at least part of the capital.
