Brownlee was attacked April 1, 1971, by five hooded men while on his way home from a school board meeting.

He said he was forced to stop by a car that partly blocked the road in front of a bridge. A second car following his pulled up behind him and stopped, blocking him in.

Brownlee said one of the men put a shotgun to his head and said, "Turn off your lights and get out of the car." He said he was then knocked to the ground and one of the men pulled a five-gallon can of tar from another car and poured it on him.
