Your own excellent and impartial reporting of the current New Orleans Grand Jury investigation, so clearly in the honorable but on this subject usually forgotten tradition of American journalism, inspires the hope that you will print my letter to Senator Kuchel in answer to the speech reported by your Washington bureau July 13.

You should have copies of all three of my books by now. I have received no acknowledgment of receipt of PHOTOGRAPHIC WHITEWASH: SUPPRESSED KENNEDY ASSASSINATION PICTURES, which I mailed you several weeks ago. I regret I have no Louisiana outlets, so if it has not reached you, please let me know and as soon as the rail strike is ended I will mail however many copies you may desire.

So this will make sense to you, I face the unfortunate necessity of being my own publisher and selling reprint rights. It is the reprint editions of WHITEWASH: THE REPORT ON THE WARREN REPORT and WHITEWASH II: THE FBI-SECRET SERVICE COVER-UP that are available in New Orleans. As of now, any of your readers who want the third book must get it from me. To make this less difficult, we add but five cents to the bookstore price to cover mailing and handling costs, making the charge a round five dollars.
