

Unit Urged to Decide On New Kennedy Study

Washington, Sept. 28 (UPI)—Rep. Theodore H. Kupferman (R-N.Y.) today proposed a congressional committee be created to decide if there should be a new investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy.

Kupferman said he planned to introduce a resolution to that effect in the House because of what he described as a "new wave of criticism" of the Warren Commission and its report on the assassination.
