Dear Mr. Kaufman,

Thanks for the release Karen Rosenberg sent me. I like the language of the beginning better than the earlier ones! I'll be on a plane for several hours tomorrow and again on Saturday and will read it then, perhaps, if I can do in en route Hobart College, I can comment on it there and on your Congressman being the only one in the House raising his voice.

I have just finished the draft of my third book. In the coming month I hope to complete the draft of the fourth, which I had laid aside to do the third. Then, I hope in not more than another month, I'll have completed WHITEWASH III, which I had to lay aside for the other two. But I have a vast amount of material, some of which you may not imagine exists.

I also have a few volunteer private sources of information who have told me things that are shocking yet to a large degree confirmable from the public record that is just not understood and has never really been examined impartially.

My apprehensions over the pix and X-rays have not eased. There is no chain of possession. If they show exactly what the report says and if they are genuine, they do not validate the report, but the excessive attention they have received along this line will make it seem they can and do.

I have another line of approach on that. Perhaps we will both have time in the near future to discuss it.
