His message said you had been unwell recently and asked that those who admire your work drop you a line or two to wish you well. I have never met either you or Mr. Keck, but I have seen many interviews you have given over the past years about your work on the JFK case.

I have indeed admired your work and have used some of your interviews when teaching British youngsters about the assassination.

I teach in a large comprehensive school in Liverpool (no Beatles on roll). Part of the National Curriculum which we all have by law to teach, includes USA political history of the 1960's. I make it my business to include the JFK assassination.


I was 13 when JFK was shot and have followed developments ever since. Last year, I realised a boyhood dream and took my family to Dallas for a month.

My children and I spent a long time just sitting on the grassy knoll, talking and wondering what the world might have been like if JFK had lived.

Me and my daughter Christina who is 12, spent some time on the 6th floor and we sat together and looked out over the plaza. (Joel my lad is 6 and decided an ice cream with his Mum was more interesting.....he'll learn). Christina began to cry at the thought of such a great man being so brutally murdered and the truth never being allowed to come out. She actually said that she couldn't believe such a huge crime could be done in such a small place by just one man.

Anyway Mr. Weisber, I don't want to prattle on too much, just to wish you a speedy recovery and to say that your work is appreciated by many people here in England.
