Our local radio station, WTOP, at 1220, is too close to time out in order to get WCAO at Philadelphia, so I have to wait until midnight, when our station signs off, to get Philadelphia on their repeat program. Fortunately, I tuned in on your interview of 2 or 3 weeks ago, but regarded some young men as being most interruptive and disconcerting - quite offensive.

I was pleased to tune in your interview of a few days ago - and am getting quite impatient to receive my 2 copies of your book.

Not only do I believe your estimation to be entirely correct in refuting accepted "close of case" - but your careful calculations appear to bear you out & keep the case open. What about the "action" which caused the glass to the top of the window frame which, I believe, the shots were at first thought to come? Has this been forgotten - or lost - as were the primary papers on the autopsy? There is much much more to be known - and your title of "Whitewash" I regard as quite apt.
