Paper Told Not to Print Phone Numbers

LOS ANGELES (AP) - A judge prohibited the antiestablishment Los Angeles Free Press Friday from publishing any more names, addresses. and telephone numbers of California narcotic agents.

The weekly newspaper published Thursday a list of 80 agents based in Los Angeles, Santa Ana, San Diego, and San Francisco, giving their home addresses and phone numbers.

The list was accurate, says Gary Shoemaker, Los Angeles area supervisor for the state narcotics bureau.
