## Lane Recording Went to Warren Group in July

A TRANSCRIPT of a telephone conversation that New York attorney Mark Lane says he had with a witness to the shooting of Dallas Policeman J. D. Tippit, is buried deep in one of the volumes of the hearings before the Warren Commission.

Lane has used a recording of the conversation to argue that it was not Lee Harvey Oswald who killed Tippit a few minutes after President Kennedy was assassinated because the witness, Helen Markham, said that the killer had "somewhat bushy" hair. The transcript shows that Mrs. Markham said the killer's hair was "a little bit bushy" in referring to the fact that it was uncombed.

Lane refused to turn the

Lane refused to turn the recording over to the Warren Commission in both his appearances before it as a witness, but he submitted it last July after his second appearance. The Washington Post incorrectly reported on Jan. 17 that Lane refused to turn over the recording.
