George O'Toole studied the many existing tape recorded statements made by witnesses to the event and by witnesses to events that appeared at first to be peripheral to the assassination. During his inquiry he focused on one area that the rest of us had, by and large, missed: the possible role of Buell Wesley Frazier in the November events in Dallas. Frazier had driven Oswald to the Texas School Book Depository that incredible day and had transported Oswald's package. Did that package contain a rifle or cuttain rods? How were Frazier's actions assessed by the Dallas authorities? Was Frazier given a polygraph examination that day? George O'Toole, aided by the PSE, explored those questions in depth and if he, one man without the power of subpoena, has been unable to find the relevant answers he has nevertheless posed the relevant questions. The questions require answers. Perhaps the Select Committee on Assassinations of the House of Representatives, which George O'Toole has briefed, will now help to provide the answers.

I did not know George O'Toole when his book was first published in 1975. I walked through the streets of Manhattan and read the huge advertisements on the buses, in the New York Times, at the magazine racks and on the newspaper stands. They dared to proclaim that Oswald was not the lone assassin of President Kennedy A new, strong voice for the truth was being heard.

Soon, of course, I met him. When we formed the Citizens Commission of Inquiry in Washington, D.C. to work for a scrious investigation by the Congress into the assassination he soon became a dear and trusted friend and his advice and wisdom and good humor have constituted a constant in the hard days of frequent disappointments.

It is ironic to porc over yellowing CIA documents initiated a decade ago that were designed to discredit me and to destroy my work and the work of other critics of the Warren Commission and to know that George O'Toole had served

as Chief of the Problems Analysis Branch of the Company.

Perhaps even of greater significance than the substantial contribution that The Assassination Tapes has made to the body of knowledge is the proof that advanced technology and miracles may co-exist in the latter part of this century. A tape recording may indicate that a winess is telling the truth and a man of impeccable honesty may emerge from the CIA.
