

Oswald's Gun Fired 2 Shots, Expert Says

CORONADO, Calif., Feb. 24 (AP)—An independent medical investigator, confirming the findings of the Warren Commission, says only two bullets were fired at President Kennedy and both came from the gun of Lee Harvey Oswald.

The conclusion reached by Dr. John K. Lattimore, the first outsider permitted to look at the Kennedy autopsy photographs and X-rays, agrees with the commission's finding that Oswald alone killed Mr. Kennedy on a Dallas street in 1963.

Dr. Lattimore, an expert on medical ballistics, is president of the American Urological Association and chairman of the urology department at Columbia University School of Medicine in New York.

In an interview, Mr. Lattimore said last night, "If you look at the evidence, both bullets were recovered and both came out of Oswald's gun to the exclusion of all other guns."
