Pages go from 2a to 3c.

4 shows two residences, names masked, on N.O. city map. These two close to Industrial canal.

Throughout unjustified and unnecessary maskings, from names of agents to those of members of the Stein family, which are publicly known.

32ff records phone calls seem to trace to Steins. Rite apparently worked at Ivanhoe Piano ^{Co}, 601 Bourbon.

70-1 Rooming houses 500-1200 Napoleon Ave. checked for ^{alt} aliases then known. Negative.

Although prior investigations indicated little likelihood of any Stein family involvement ~~with~~ in the crime or that the packages of clothing for Martin's daughter could have had any connection with it these matters were followed and reported in some detail.

On the other hand, where there was a lead requiring diligent pursuit, the allegation from Stein that Ray had mentioned a contact in contracting or engineering and in the Jackson "arracks area or along the Industrial Canal, is entirely unmentioned in this consolidated report.
