The Chief Justice said impatience with courts is great when a crime is particularly odious and a defendant's guilt appears obvious. But he said that when a defendant is granted a new trial it is important to "evaluate what has occurred in the larger perspective of the Constitution."

In such cases, he said, the accused may not have been accorded the right to counsel. or a confession may have been extorted from him, or he may have been convicted on illegally seized evidence.

Constitutional bars to these

practices "can never be com-promised by short cuts," Warren said.
