## Campus Police In Missouri

Compile Files

ST. LOUIS, April 21 (AP)—
Campus police at the University of Missouri campus at Columbia have entered university offices without search warrants and have compiled files on about 1,000 persons, the St. Louis Post-Dispatch reported yesterday. ported yesterday.

The newspaper quoted a source who had worked with the files as saying the police collected information on faculty and students on such matters as possible involvement with drugs, homosexual activities and involvement in radical causes.

The collection of names was The collection of names was carried out mostly during political protest activities between 1969 and 1972, the newspaper quoted the source as saying, but it added that surveillance of persons considered radical continues, at a reduced level.
