If we have to go into Frederick tomorrow, I'll get the rifle for Bud, for the pay for it is now all we can expect until after the first of the year, when Bill's income will not be enough to meet what we will have to pay the bank in January. There are other crisis-type things with which I'll have to contend. The latest on David Osterbridge is represented in the enclosed carbon. Although I do not anticipate any need to see Bud in the immediate future, should he find one I think it would be better to avoid it, for just seeing him in this context would remind me too much of some of the wretched things he has said and done with regard to money.
