Dear Jim,

Thnaka for your letter actually dated January 28 and for the MacRae decision. Glad to hear from Dave that the elevated PSA test did not signify prostate cancer. I presume your doctors will keep close tabs. I have had some good experience with proscar it will not hurt you to know. There is another medication of which some seem to have a higher opinion. Before proscar was approved I was on a monthly injection of something from Japan, injected at Hopkins, and the damned stuff cost about \$400 per shot, for the medication alone. Once proscar was approved I've been on it. I was given to understand that getting 10 years from a TURP is pretty good. I'm on my 13th with the medication and with indications for some time that something other than the TURP will be called for soon.

The top man at Hopkins in urology and on that test is named Walsh. I am more feeble than I've ever been. Some of the newer deterioration may be from going from the thigh-length anti-embolism stocking to knee length but it may be general deterioration. My body now wants more sleep and I give it that. Listening to it. But I've gotten a rather surprising amount of work done, as Dave can tell you.

I have what I've started on Posner in mind, I've not taken time to outline or I'd not have been able to make the record for history that I have. It will be more than Posner. You may remember I had some ideas for The King Conspiracies on paper when we filed 1996 and then, no black interest, returned to JFK. I'll want to pick some of that up.

I've skimmed the Posner and it is superficial on the crime and poisonous on Ray. I'll spend little time on his presumption of guilt and if I've the gofer help will go heavily on what was exculpatory - all of which Posner knew about from his days here and he knew it was all available.

I have not thought it all through yet and have to wonder how much I'll be up to but I plan to use what I wrote you about, would like to use some of the interceptions, the Huie grand jury testimony, and how I wish I had your account of what Foreman did when he merely thought of my name. He did flee a TV studio to avoid me. I'll want to use the best of our testimony and the words of their's. Plus the threat to me and my having to get a lawyer. Interception of your mail and us shadowed. Anything you can think of, and it will be good if you can find the time to go over it. It might, with editing, be publishable if I can ridicule him enough. And not turn off those who publish in love with the official myth. What I've done on Harsh should, with editing, be publishable. So you can see why, aside from completeness at Hood, I'd like all the exhibits. My copies of the pictures I let Bud have and use have been stolen! All of them have been! 
Dear Harold:
