He also stried that after this, someone who had the key came into this office and when he, Mr. Rewman, asked them what they were doing there, this man stated that he was taking over the office, Mr. Newman stated that he took the key from this man and put him out. Mr. Newman stated that he as a white male, blond hiar, and red complexion. When asked, Mr. Newman stated that he know nothing of the organization, Fair Play for Cuba.

Wr. Newman showed the officers a page in a small notebook which he took from his pocket. On this page were the following two names: Louis Rhysh, who kir. Sidney Edward Voebel, this data,

The undersigned officers respectfully report that at about 11.45 A.M., this date, Wednesday, Hovember 27, 1963, they entered the Quality Florists, located 4916 Canal Street, for the purpose of meeting with and interviewing Sidney Edward Voebel relative to his knowledge of Lee Harvey Oswald.

Sidney Voobel identified hirself to the officers and stated that he is 23 years of age, D.O.B. 4/24/40. He stated that he was born in New Orleans and has resided at 4916 Canal Street, the Quality Florists, owned by his parents, since that time.

Vobbel streed that he attended Beauregard Judion High School until 1955, and that he met Oswald while at this school as Oswald attended school there also. Whebel stated that he joined the Civil Mir Patrol Cadets at Misant Airport in 1954 or 1955 (not sure). Woebel sked Oswald to join also and Csvald did Join a short time after Yoeble, but only stayed about one month. Woebel stated that Oswald bought his uniform and that he, Yoebel, beliaves Oswald received his membership card.

Veebel further stated that he first met Oswald in 1954 or 1955 and knew him for about 13 years. Yeebel stated that he fook music lessons at Werleins on Canal Street and would go to Granids home at 126 Exchange Place to see Oswald on these dates. Yeebel also stated that Oswald had montioned distributing advertising circulars while in school. When asked if Oswald ever expressed political views to Veebel, Veebel stated that oswald had not, and that he, Voebel, beleived Oswald him to Leffist political views until later in his life. Yeebel stated that he believed Oswald attended a party (not sure) at the home of Dave Ferrie (Gaphain) right after the members of the A.P.C. received their stripes.

and stated that he knew very little. Yoshel stated that Ferrie took over the C.A.P.G. at Poisant Airport about 6 months after he, Yoshel, had joined. Yoshel stated that Ferrie seemed like a "character", that he rode a rotorcycle, and Yoshel stated that he had heard that Ferrie was a brilliant man with many degrees. When maked if Ferrie had organized any flying group other than

the G.A.P.G., Voebal stated that he did not know of any. When aked if had ever heard of the Engle Squadron, Voebal stated that he had hot. When asked if he, Voebal had ever flown with Dave Ferrie, Voebal stated that he had not, but other boys had made local flights with him. When asked if he know of Ferrie flying on long trips, out of this country, Voebal stated that he did not.


