SMITH INDICTED

Smith was indicted by the East Baton Rouge Parish Grand Jury in its probe into published claims that racketeers exercise influence over state government.

He was accused of offering Aubrey Young, former aide to McKeithen, \$25,000 to influence him in his post, an offer which authorities said was part of an effort to buy freedom for former Teamster Union President to Novel the official parish air-James Hoffa. The former Team-plane for transportation into ster boss was imprisoned for East Baton Rouge Parish and jury tampering.
