Another former juror expressed the opinion that Dr. Grey is being used by Kohn.

"I think it is safe to say Dr. Grey is being used by Mr. Kohn," said S. B. Pendley.

Another, Joseph Misshore, said he considered it "very strange" that the MCC has never had any Negro members.

Jolet quoted a former informant of Kohn's as saying he told Kohn "anything he wanted to he a r." The informant was 1 Pershing Gervais, a former chief investigator for District Attorney Jim Garrison, Jolet later said.

Kohn "has to keep this thing f

going because, I understand, he has a very handsome salary. I h would try to make my job look important too," Jolet said.

In the other statement, the li charges by Dr. Grey and Kohn b were made subsequent to a news conference last week at v which two of the six ex-jurors, W Mrs. Delores V. Mason-Smith N and Walter O. Eckhert Sr., N made comments about the MCC and Kohn.

The statement was penned by Mrs. Mason-Smith and signed by Sylvan B. Pendley, Eckert, Albert Flair, Robert P. Jolet, Laurence Martin, Joseph O. Misshore Jr., John R. Nides and Louis Brothers.

The statement said Kohn and Dr. Grey would have the public believe the jurors were unintelligent individuals and that they sat silent with no thoughts of their own.

"Mr. Kohn knows this is not true," the statement continued. "As for Dr. Grey, he could not possibly know what goes on in the grand jury room regarding legal advice given the grand jury by the district attorney's office unless he had the room bugged, since he did not enter the room.

"As to Mr. Kohn's treatment in the grand jury room, Dr. Grey must have heard that only from Mr. Kohn and that leaves open two schools of thought. Was it true? or was the secrecy of the grand jury room violated? Mr. Kohn also knows the answer to this . . ."
