Former McKeithen Aide Admits Arranging Talk

But Young Says He Did Not Know Purpose

Aubrey Young, a former aide to Gov. John J. McKeithen, said in Baton Rouge Tuesday that he arranged a meeting there between Teamsters Union head Edward Grady Partin and a contractor who brought up the name of James R. Hoffa.

However, Young said he had no knowledge of the purpose of the meeting and did not sit through it.

Young, former security officer for McKeithen, said that when the man began discussing Hoffa with Partin, "I left the meeting."

"I am sure the FBI, with whom I have cooperated, knows all of the above is true," Young

ISSUES STATEMENT

He issued his statement after Life magazine published an article which said that Partin, whose testimony helped put na-tional Teamster boss Hoffa behind bars, turned down a bribe of \$1 million to recant or "taint" his testimony.

The magazine says that the \$1 million attempted bribery of Partin was made through "friends of Hoffa" and the Cosa Nostra-the national crime

Partin, leader of the Teamsters local in Baton Rouge, was i a government witness against Hoffa at a 1964 trial in Chattanooga, Tenn., which led to conviction of Hoffa on a charge of conspiring to tamper with a federal jury.

Hoffa is serving an eight-year prison term.

The Life article says \$2 million was made available to Cosa Nostra mobsters "to be made payable to anyone who could wreck the government's jury-tampering case on which Hoffa had been convicted."

Concerning the article, Young J made this statement:
