Mrs. Evelyn Lincoln, secretary to former President Kennedy, telephoned and made reference to her earlier call last August. At that time Mrs. Lincoln at the request of Mrs. John Kennedy sought information as to the location and availability of the clothing worn by President Kennedy at the time of his assassination. It was explained to Mrs. Lincoln at that time that this was a matter within the jurisdiction of the President's Commission.

Today, Mrs. Lincoln said that following our earlier conversation she had gotten in touch with Warren Commission counsel, Lee Rankin, who had assured that the President's clothing would be returned following the submission of the Warren Commission's report. Mrs. Lincoln has heard nothing further from Mr. Rankin and asked what else she could do.

After checking, Mrs. Lincoln was informed that the President's Commission still has an office and it was suggested she endeavor to contact Mr. Rankin through the Commission office here in Washington. She was furnished the telephone number and the name of Mr. Rankin's secretary there.

Mrs. Lincoln was most appreciative and said she was going to pursue this matter further in view of the interest of the President's widow.
