I am sorry (but not surprised) to be obliged to tell you that The Post is not going to use your book. No magazine is physically able to publish such a work for the simple reason that its value depends upon copious documentation. As you know, I have two copies of the manuscript. I am sending one to our representatives in London and will use the first copy for publishing houses here. You know of course that the chances of finding a sponsor for the book are very slim. I tell you this so that we do not fall into the error of indulging in false hopes.

I would like to see you try the story of moving to the country and what happened to you there.

The Speaking Out, which I enclose, is not right for the Department. Reference to the Warren Report manuscript would make it unacceptable.

I will keep you posted.
