

ng the Commission, President Lyndon Johnson had one goal: the assassination was a Communist plot. n52 Johnson thought that Kennedy's murder could precipitate World War III. n53 Soviet Union and his trip to visit the Soviet Embassy in Moscow before the murder pointed to Communist intrigue. n54 Such a possibility because Oswald had identified himself with the Fair Play for Cuba organization openly supportive of Castro and sharply against Cuba policy. n55 Thus, the Commission was under enormous pressure to give an answer that discounted foreign influence. n56
