The family of the late Senator Edward V. Long (Dem-Mo.), who reportedly said a short time before he died that he may have been given poisoned candy, has agreed to a request to have his body exhumed for examination if certain conditions are met.

Prosecuting Attorney Thomas I. Osborne of Audrain county last week requested an exhumation after Long's secretary to Id authorities. the senator may have been murdered by poisoned candy. The secretary, Helen Dunlop, has been named in a \$3.25 million alienation of affection suit filed by Long's widow.

Long died Nov. 6, 1972. His will left Mrs. Long and their daughter, Mrs. Frank Miller, \$10 each. He left the remainder of his estate, estimated at more than \$2 million, to his 5-year-old granddaughter, Ann Miller, Miss Dunlop, Long's secretary for 26 years, was named executrix. The Long family is contesting the will.

The St. Louis Globe-Democrat said in a copy-right story yesterday that. Miss Dunlop said she "fold the truth" during the test.

Mrs. Long's attorney, Marion F. Wasinger of Hannibal, said he sent a letter of permission for the exhumation to Osborne yesterday.
