Dear Harold,  
This is just a short note concerning magazines etc. I have just written to Schoener and in mentioning copies of Faris Match I remembered two other things that I thought might be of interest; although they in fact contain little of anything new to you I just thought I'd mention them. First is the Sunday Times magazine of Oct. 9 1966 which contains the article "Insight: ~~the~~ President Kennedy The crucial evidence". It contains a summary of the evidence mainly against the Commission's report. It is almost unparallel now but the bookseller friend in Fortrose located a copy but since I already have a copy and it would have cost over £2 I did not buy it.

Second is the Jackdaw Special "The Assassination of President Kennedy" which was published over here to coincide with the paperback edition of "Push to Judgement". It too is a summary of the evidence against the Report, it includes a copy of the full Aigens photo, life-size drawing of 02766 rifle, Autopsy face-sheet, autopsy report page 6, Comm. Exib. 385, and several other things including a carbide out-out tool of Dealey Plaza. I don't know if you are already aware of these, or even if they are of interest (since they contain little if anything that will be new to you).

Regarding Faris Match, if my friend in Fortrose is unable to locate a copy I will send you my copies since I am sure they will be more useful in your possession than in mine. I look forward to receiving your new book in the near future.
