Dear Congressman Lott,

At the request of Jim Brown I am happy to send you the enclosed copy of the fourth of the WHITWASH series on the JFK assassination.

Also enclosed is a list of my earlier works. If you would like any, please let me know.

Jim Lesar and I had hoped to give every Member a copy of this book prior to the vote on the Freedom of Information Law. Our work in the case of James Earl Ray is among the factors that made this impossible. Another is our financial limitations. However, if there is any Member you would like to have a copy, if you would be kind enough to send me an addressed envelope and any enclosure you might want with it ~~sent~~ as soon as possible I will do it.

The immediate pressures of the Ray case, which account for the appearance of this letter, should ease after the end of this week. If I can be of any service to you on either the JFK assassination interest Jim Brown says you have or with regard to the Ray/King case, in which I hope as a member of the Judiciary committee you might interest yourself, I would welcome the opportunity.

My interests and work include what is known by the generic The Watergate. These interests center around what has not appeared in any book of which I know and were not the focus of any official investigation. I am nearing the end of that manuscript. If you can provide me with any of the material your committee published, I would appreciate it. Together with my voluminous files, they would then wind up in a college archive .
