Perhaps you recall the note you sent me on the left-hand side of your Texas Bank & Trust check, perhaps you do not. I hope you do. It reads, "I should like to talk to you if you are ever in Texas. The book is extremely interesting, since I personally know some of the persons named".

I forgot your name hence was not able to get in touch with you when I was, briefly, in Dallas the end of last year. I stumbled on your note just now and write immediately. Unfortunately, I do not anticipate being in Dallas again in the foreseeable future. I'd like very much to be. In the time I was there, everyone I sought to speak to did see me and only two of three feared permitting me to tape record the interview (which is for purposes of assuring accuracy and totality of recall not otherwise possible).
