Dear Mr. Weisberg.

I am hoping my name may seem familiar to you. We exchanged several letters last year which were very helpful to me in understanding your thoughts and your work on the assassination of our late president John F. Kennedy.

My wife and I purchased our first home in January and we have remained quite busy enhancing it.

However, it is high time to write again. Allow me to explain.

In late September, I will finally get the chance to visit some old friends in New York City, with whom I worked as an actor for almost five years. I've been away and back in my home state of Minnesota for almost as long, so I am very excited to return. I am considering making a brief trip to Frederick if you would be willing to grant me the honor of meeting you. I have a few questions I would like to ask you regarding your work and this famous case that, it seems to me, would be far easier in person than via the typewriter or computer. I would ask about fifteen minutes of your time. I am not a writer and I would not seek to use or publish any of our discussion in a public manner.

I know that you are a busy, respected and sought-after man, and now that the files pertaining to the case have been opened to the public, you are likely being called upon to comment. Also, I am aware that my visit from 9/22-9/29 falls over Yom Kippur and I do not wish to disrupt your holiday nor your schedule in general. I am aware that this request comes out of the blue from someone you do not know, and I completely understand if you are unable to see me. However, also know that I would be extremely grateful if we could meet.

Please note the self-addressed stamped envelope for your convenience. My wish is to drive to Frederick on Monday the 27th or Tuesday the 28th. If you are able to reply, I will write or call from New York to confirm directions, date and time.
