Dear Harold:

I have read <u>Photographic Whitewash</u> over the last several days. I am amazed at the lack of interest shown by the Commissioners and the F.B.I.'s Director in securing reasonably good copies of all of that kind of evidence. Indeed, I do accept your position throughout this book as my own!

However, I do not believe the Altgens photo (as it appears in <u>Whitewash</u>, for example) shows L. H. Oswald in the door at the time of the shooting itself; rather, it seems to me to be Billy Lovelady. The shirt is confusing, it looks as if it does not really fit him properly!? Of course, it is possible that B. N. Lovelady owned a shirt that is similar to Oswald's? In any event, I admit this fact (as I interpret it...) only fails to corroborate Carolyn Arnold's testimony, who puts Oswald on the first floor, ten or fifteen minutes prior to the assassination.

I am no longer so sure about Oswald's involvement in the planning of the assassination. I do not think that he carried it out, of course. But, it is my view that he was killed simply because he knew too much about the planning of same. Likewise, I do not, yet, believe, that he was the source of information to the F.B.I. prior to the assassination, which was sent out by J. Edgar Hoover to all of the field offices before Nov. 22. 1963. It seems that quite a few people knew about it! In writing to you today, I wish to ask you about any future books that you may have considered writing (and/or publishing) about the House Committee Hearings of 1978-79? G. Robert Blakey's 1981 book seems to try to pin the entire assassination on the Mafia! It is really disappointing, since it is a long-winded chronology of general mafia history that has absolutely nothing whatsoever to do with the assassination. The 1989 book by John H.
