Dear Gary,

After we spoke I heard from the local post office. <sup>My</sup> complaint has been forwarded to the postal inspector in Baltimore.

I hope you find time to send me what we spoke of this morning and if Dave Perry has prepared a memo of what you said he was <sup>S</sup>taying on top of I'd appreciate that and can have some use for it perhaps soon.

If Waybright was fired, as you indicated was to have happened this morning, that does not <sup>or address</sup> end our problem.

In general I think I should be as fully informed as possible so that when there is the opportunity to make use of the information I'll be able to, without delays. For example, I was to have had a copy of <sup>H</sup>arry's last letter from <sup>H</sup>arry and it is not here. I should have been able to give it to the post office and when I speak to my friend the former local chief of police, I want to be able to give him all that is relevant and not to be annoying him.

I think it is possible that he can refer or <sup>ad</sup>introduce me to the proper authority.

Enclosed is a copy of the <sup>M</sup>aryland statute that is applicable. Federal appears not to fit as well. It is 18 USC 875,876.

If I get any news before mail in the a.m. I'll enclose it.
