This is not the first time Ragano has sought to capitalize on his relationship with Hoffa. In 1982, he made efforts to produce a movie about "the life and death of Jimmy Hoffa," who was presumably murdered in 1975. Ragano sold percentages of the prospective profits to local investors. He was convicted for failing to report \$107,000 of the money he took in on his 1982 and 1983

In a related development, former House Assassinations Committee chairman Louis Stokes (D-Ohio) said he is actively exploring the possibility of releasing all that is "releasable" from committee records put under a 50-year seal. He said he is disturbed by Oliver Stone's movie, "JFK," and its charges of government involvement in a conspiracy to kill Kennedy and to cover it up.
