KOHN SAID MENEFEE, A RACING COMMISSIONER UNDER GOV. EARL LONG AND CONSERVATION COMMISSIONER UNDER MCKEITHEN, TESTIFIED, "NO, SIR. I DO NOT. I EMPHATICALLY DENY THAT ANYONE GAVE ME THE MONEY."

JOSEPH A. PHILLIPS, CHIEF LAWYER FOR THE HOUSE COMMITTEE, ASKED KOHN IF HE THOUGHT SOMEBODY HAD COMMITTED PERJURY.

"CERTAINLY," KOHN SAID. HE SAID HE WOULD ASK THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY OF JEFFERSON PARIS (COUNTY) TO "INSTITUTE PERJURY PROCEEDINGS AGAINST MR. MENEFEE." AGAINST MR. MEN 5/31-GE115P MENEFEE."
