Burt Griffin is one instance. Schwäiker another. Then there is what has to be a Commission staffer, called "man" only, whose words could be useful in court cases under some conditions, like how truthful the CIA was and is.

One thing Captain Smith said could be of possible use to Jim in a case. It is that the Memphis police gave the FBI copies of their reports.

So, besides saying thanks I'd like to know if it is okay to make such uses of parts of the transcripts.

If you know the omitted names, like this "man" who was on the WC staff, I'd appreciate them so I can add them and so these pages can have more historical value.

If your people are reminiscing about the 60s they are not the only ones planning to do this on TV.

When you have time, if you'd care to do a cover page of sorts to go with these transcripts for the time they are deposited in the University archive please do it.
