BALTIMORE, April 26 (AP)
—William Manchester, author of a book on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, has written an article favorable to the candidacy of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy.

Manchester had differences of opinion with the Kennedy family before publication of his book, "The Death of a President."

Writing in today's Baltimore Evening Sun, Manchester said:

"We can never re-create Camelot which, like the golden age of Pericles, wasn't flawless anyhow. However, an improvement upon the present disarray is certainly possible, and those who yearn for it should regard the new Kennedy campaign as auspicious . . ."

"It is highly likely that Kennedy II would restore much that we have missed in the last four and a half years: the allegiance of youth, a sense of excitement about the Federal Government, and the involvement of America's best minds in national affairs."
