**Sorensen Denies
Censor Charge**

NEW YORK (AP) — Theodore C. Sorensen, former adviser to President John F. Kennedy, says author William Manchester made a "highly inaccurate reference" to him in an article in Look magazine.

Sorensen told a news conference Thursday that there was "not an ounce of truth" in Manchester's report that Sorensen had allowed his book, "Kennedy," to be censored.

"I didn't give way, I didn't yield principle" Sorensen said. "There was no censorship. The thing is of whole cloth."
