**Censor Right
Seen Waived
By Mrs. JFK**

NEW YORK, Jan. 5 (UPI) — The publishing house of Harper & Row told the State Supreme Court today that as far as it is concerned, Mrs. John F. Kennedy has "waived any alleged personal rights of approval which she might have had" in connection with William Manchester's "The Death of a President".

The firm submitted papers to Justice Saul S. Streit in answer to Mrs. Kennedy's suit to obtain an injunction blocking publication of the controversial book about her husband's assassination. It was learned that a temporary injunction that originally applied to the firm, Look magazine, and Manchester has been lifted against Harper & Row and marked off the court calendar with the approval of attorneys by both sides and Streit.

Earlier, Mrs. Kennedy reached an agreement with Look magazine for serialization of the book after revisions and deletions of matter objectionable to her were made in the text. The first installment of the serialization will be on newsstands next Tuesday.
