The attached records are from the FBI's 62-109060 file, on the assassination of President Kennedy. There are identified by their serial numbers: 5241, 5232, 5203, 5274, 5295, 5334, 5589, 5815, 5818, and what is known as a Not Recorded Serial, because it is a duplicate of a record that is "recorded" in another file, the Jones to Wick memo of 6/2/67. (In this case the man file identification was eliminated in the FBI's xeroxing. Likely on the book or author.) These people were, I believe, in the DeLoach office.

Together with xeroxes I sent you earlier these are all the records I have seen that relate, directly or indirectly, to the matter of the House assassins committee. And, of course, its irresponsibilities.

It has been some time since I read these records. My intention was to review them after I made copies for my own subject filing and to prepare a memo relating to them. I'm sorry that has not been possible.

Because this is not now possible and because I will be in Washington on the 4th, with transportation, I'll deliver these then.

These come from an extensive file, one of three rather large ones totalling close to 100,000 pages. I obtained them as a result of C.A. 77-2155. They are now in the public domain. This means that anyone who makes an appointment in advance can go to the FBI's public reading room and examine them. If he can find them among 100,000 unindexed pages.

From the examination I have made to date of the third of these files, styled an Oswald file, I do not expect to find more records that may interest you. I've gone through the entire "commission" and "assassination" files.

The marks added represent indexing instructions. There are "main files" on a subject and "see" references.

It is not impossible that the Oswald file will have references to some of the matters misrepresented and misused by the assassins committee. If so I will probably come to them.
