Even more significantly, the recent assertions of author Donald Spoto, that Monroe and Bobby *never* had an affair, are about to be challenged with a vengeance by C. David Heymann in his coming blockbuster biography on Robert Kennedy. I understand that Heymann has obtained truly spectacular evidence that will prove once and for all that Monroe and the attorney general were doing more than exchanging ideas on politics and civil rights. Some of it, I hear, is in the form of tapes, supposedly made by Marilyn herself.
