Ex-Consul Of Cuba Dies In Caracas

Carlos Marquez, former Cuban consul general here until his retirement in 1959 on the rise of Fidel Castro, died yesterday at Caracas, Venezuela. He was 62.

Mr. Marquez went to Venezuela in February for an operation and was convalescing when stricken by another illness.

Funeral services will be conducted in Venezuela.

Mr. Marquez served the Cuban government here for more than 25 years as consul and later as consul general.

Previously, he had been a member of the Cuban Delegation to the League of Nations at Geneva, Switzerland, and had served as secretary of the Cuban embassy in Washington.

He was a graduate of the University of Havana.

Mr. Marquez is survived by his wife, the former Elena de la Cruz; two daughters, Mrs. Isabel Marquez Perdomo of New Orleans, and Mrs. Lenor Marquez Sucre of Caracas, and seven grandchildren.
